



WRITER'S BLOCK by Lauren Dunlop

When a playwright, sitting on a deadline, is struggling for ideas, he desperately pens a few basic characters to get himself started. However, then they come to life in his imagination things begin to get more complicated. The characters have no intention of cooperating: the romantic leads hate each other, the heroine falls for the villain, the secondary characters are eaten up with resentment, and chaos break out. When the characters decide to take over and write the play themselves, the audience is felt to consider the question: How much control do we really have over our own destiny?

THICKER THAN WATER by Ben Humphrey
