

FULL LENGTH - SETS

IF I WERE YOU by Alan Ayckbourn

The Rodales seem like an ordinary family, but beneath the surface things are beginning to crack. Jill and Mal have lost the spark in their marriage, their son Sam resents his father and their daughter Chrissie has recently become a mum and is dealing with marriage issues of her own. And while they all share advice on how others should live their lives, nobody is really taking it on board - until Mal and Jill see things from a dramatically different perspective, that is. Waking up one morning and finding they have switched personas, Mal in Jill's body and Jill in Mal's, they must continue life "as normal" as their other half. Jill faces the challenges of working with their son-in-law, Dean, as the Store Manager of a homewares shop, while Mal has suddenly become a housewife, learning more about his children - and finding out the secrets they already know about him!

FRANKENSTEIN by Mary Shelley, stage adaptation by Patrick Sandford

Victor Frankenstein, a brilliant and ambitious young student, discovers the secret of creating life from the remains of the dead. But elation at his triumph is replaced by horror when he sees his monstrous creation. Abandoned by the one who made him, Frankenstein's creature is left to a world that fears and rejects him, and soon his innocence turns to misery — and a murderous desire for revenge.

All the more successful for staying faithful to the dark spirit of the original book, this adaptation includes notes on the first production and can be performed with a minimum of set and props, making it well suited for staging by schools and amateur theatre groups, as well as by professional companies.

MAKING MONEY by Terry Pratchett, adapted for the stage by Stephen Briggs

Lord Vetinari wants to overhaul the banks of Ank-Morpork and reverse its citizens' outdated notion that gold is important, so he appoints former con-man Albert Spangler, aka Moist von Lipwig, to the position of Master of the Royal Mint, attached to a senior post at the Bank of

Ankh-Morpork. Then Mrs Lavish, the bank manager, dies, leaving her dog Mr Fusspot – who also happens to be the majority shareholder – to Moist. Suddenly he finds himself in charge, and his life being threatened by resentful members of the Lavish family. His talent for a swindle soon has customers queuing up, but when the chairman of the bank needs to be taken out for walkies and its chief cashier may or may not be a vampire, making money is not always easy.

THE VAMPIRE TRILOGY
(FANGHORN, EDRED, THE VAMPYRE, LUCIFER'S FAIR) by
David Pinner

Fanghorn is a darkly surrealistic comedy, which pokes fun at the Theatre of Cruelty. Fanghorn is a lesbian vampire, who invades the household of Joseph King, who may, or may not, be the First Secretary to the Minister of Defence, and hilarious emasculation and murderous mayhem follow in her wake.

Edred, the Vampyre is a thousand-year-old Anglo-Saxon bisexual vampire, who slept with Shakespeare, but never bit him. Breaking all Bram Stoker's vampire laws, Edred loves garlic and crucifixes, so he lives in the village church where he is confronted by two students who Googled him. But soon the students wish they hadn't.

Lucifer's Fair is the Hallowe'en musical play, about a fair run by the Devil to entrap unwary children. Lucifer is aided by Fangs, who is a bovver boy by day, but an incompetent vampire by night. Simultaneously scary and funny, Lucifer's Fair, with its comic spills, thrills and chills, highlights the unreliability of grownups, both the living and the undead.

PLAYING WITH MY HEART by Shaun Prendergast A group of adolescents from Byatt Gardens School and their teacher are on an enforced field trip to Gateshead's iconic sculpture Angel of the North. With their coach delayed it isn't long before squabbles, misunderstandings, jealousies and antagonisms break out that require the Angel of the North to come down from her lofty height... the arrival of their arch enemies form Lucas (or Pukus or Mucus) Green School with their jeers and taunts melds the group and when goaded into a football penalty shoot out, Ella gets the chance to redeem herself with a superb goal.
